- Trauma has a place and helps to determine who we are.

- Video shown earlier was powerful – consider including the community in it thanking the officers.
- Existing friendships have helped in many ways as it relates to the 4<sup>th</sup> Precinct situation
- Grateful to be able to serve the community. Saying that your heart leads your mind but in reality your mind leads your heart. Strive to do the right thing and move forward.
